

## Greens Committee Meeting

June 9, 2014, 6:30pm in Break room of Maintenance Building

### Attendees:

Everyone commented on the great condition of the golf course and the recovery from a harsh winter. A few areas are still filling in, but they are well on their way.

A member asked about the possibility of planting a new tree on the 4<sup>th</sup> fairway, near the dogleg, to help discourage players from cutting the corner. After a brief discussion it was decided that no tree will be planted, because the area is very wet, we need the sun on the fairway in that area, and no one saw a tree as much of a deterrent for the big hitters.

Sue was asked to go over the moving of the gazebo. She noted that outside people had agreed to move the building to the far parking lot. This would allow Steve time to remove sod and grade the area. They will then replace the gazebo in the required spot within a few days. The water, electric, and gas lines will be marked prior to the grading. A member has agreed to run a new gas line from the club house to the fire pit to conform to local codes and insurance requirements. The patio and fire pit have not been purchased at this time, but are in the works.

We discussed the creation of a sod farm. That is a small area that can be used to grow and harvest sod for use on the golf course. Steve suggested the area behind and left of the 14<sup>th</sup> green. He will see what is necessary to implement this.

A discussion was held about tee placement. Steve has moved all of the white tee markers to the proper areas. Bob M and Steve will verify the distances on the card vs. the tee placement for each hole, within the next couple of weeks.

A brief comment was made about the cart paths. It was noted that the path on the 8<sup>th</sup> hole was in bad condition and a few other spots needed attention. There is

a large step at the beginning of the bridge on the 17<sup>th</sup> hole. Steve said he would look into them as time permitted.

Steve made a couple suggestions for projects for the fall “project day”. One would be leveling the approach to left side of 9<sup>th</sup> green, to allow better drainage of the green. And the other, raising the low spot on the back right of number 1 green. This would again allow better drainage of the green.

The next meeting will be scheduled in the near future.
