

Greens Committee Meeting

September 22, 2014, 6:30pm in Break room of Maintenance Building

Attendees:

Bob M informed the group that the some of the money in the "Project Fund" MAY be available to use this year. There was discussion about whether the work on the bunkers on 3 and 4, or rebuilding the tee on 9 had priority. It was finally decide by a 6 to 2 vote that the highest priority would be the following work on the 9th tee:

- Remove the trees behind the tee
- Install a 7 or 8 feet tall solid plastic (or vinyl) fence
- Extend the tee toward the green (about double the size)
- Plant sod

The estimated cost is \$7000 to \$7500 (with volunteer labor). This is the cost if for the fencing and sod.

Later that week we went to the 8th hole to discuss the work Steve is planning for this winter. After some discussion it was agreed that (looking from the tee) the first 3 pine trees (from the left) would be removed and the cart path moved to the right, next to the new tree line. Every other tree would be removed from the left of the card path near the top of the hill. The remaining trees would remain to block any shot at the green. The rough would be maintained between the fairway and the tree line/cart path. Some small hardwoods would be planted to the right of the new cart path. This work would allow better grass development on the right side of the 8th fairway. The area where the weeds are currently growing wild would be leveled with fill and covered with "plug" material. Then the tall grass would remain in the area. The majority of the group agreed with these ideas.

Both of these project ideas will be presented to the BoD at their next meeting (Monday, Oct 20) for their approval.

The date for the fall project day was set for the morning of October 25. This will be the normal “put the course to bed” work.
