I would first like to say that the course is in fantastic condition. "Well done" to Steve and his crew.

Steve has done some work on the 1st green, in the back/right corner, to allow water to drain from the green and allow better grass growth. This will help the ice damage we had over the winter. He is planning the same type of work on the left/ front of the 9th green for project day.

The greens cover raffle is on hold until spring, due to issues with printing of tickets. There may be a 50/50 for the "Men's year end" outing and the cross country. Rick Funaro and Steve Ludwin are working on details. This could give us enough money for at least 1 additional cover for the coming winter. The green committee continues to develop a plan for the right side of the 8th fairway. It involves moving hardwood trees from obscure places on the course to the area on the right side of 8th fairway, a few at a time. We would also continue to remove additional pine trees from the pine grove to allow more sun light on the fairway, without eliminating the hazard. This work will continue at a slow pace to allow the transplanted trees to develop.

I mentioned last month that a member has purchased divot mix containers that hook on your bag. This will be much more convenient for walkers to carry. The containers are located on a rack mounted between the office and the pro shop directly under the bulletin board. Please feel free to used and return them to that rack. They can be refiled from the mix on the par 3's. As you know, we all should be filling as many divots as possible.



This past month, my crew and I have been busy keeping up with setting up the course daily. Keeping up with the mowing consumes the majority of our time. The frequent thunder storms have made this challenging. Trees have been damaged and the winds knock leaves and sticks down everywhere during each storm. The wet areas of the course stay wet and the turf thins out due to this saturation for so long. We top-dressed the greens last week to help cure the black algae problem on our wet greens. This happens when you get too much rain coupled with humidity. Again it is great to have some rain occasionally but several inches a week is not good for the turf.

This past week we worked on a project to help cure a wet area. The 1st green has a low spot on it that continues to die because water collects there with every rainstorm. This area died this spring because of water laying on the green and freezing. We have seeded this area several times in the attempt to fill in the damaged area. But the rain would puddle here and the seedlings would die. The collar and rough on the right side of the green were lowered to allow excess water to run off the green during heavy rainstorms. Now the seedlings will have a better chance to survive if they are not under water several times a week. Hopefully this will solve the problem so we can have a healthy, full green that will not puddle up after a light rainstorm.

All in all I think we are in good shape. I have heard lots of compliments while out on the course lately. We will continue to seed areas that still need to fill in. The area on #1 is one area that needed more attention than just seeding. This low area will always be a problem until the water can move of the green. So taking the time to fix it right will be better for the future. This area and others will continue to get attention until the entire course is full and lust. Thank you to our volunteers who have been doing fairway divots out on the course. I cannot keep up with the divots without your help. Thank you.



Bunker Raking

I would just like to take a quick moment to remind all to please rake the traps when you are finished in them as it makes a big difference for the next player. If you happen to see someone you are playing with not cleaning up after themselves, it is ok to let them know that they need to do the right thing and clean up after themselves. We appreciate your help in this tiny matter. Remember, we are all in this together.

We would like to thank all for your patience in allowing the outside events that we have had this season on other days than Mondays as it is crucial to Ballston Spa Country Club to meet our budgeting needs and keep the dues structure in tact. Golf Tip for the Month

One important fundamental in the game of golf is Alignment. It is a key part of hitting a good golf shot. There are times when you may hit a straight shot but it may be left or right of the actual target. Your body may have been pointed in that direction before you ever started your backswing. Take the extra 10 seconds to pick out a point between your ball and the target where you are actually trying to hit your golf shot. I think you will be amazed at the results. The direction your body FEELS like your pointing is not always the reality of where you are pointing.


Parsing the 19th
