It seems this past week we have gotten all the rain that we should have gotten in the month of April. We are totaling 5 inches as of Friday the 19th. The excessive rain has made the course very lush and green, which is great but makes it a challenge to mow. My crew and I have been trying to keep up but we are ready for some sun. This past week I have allowed cart out on the course to allow everyone to play. I want to remind everyone that CART PATHS ONLY mean CART PATHS ONLY. All the fairways are extremely wet and don't need any more compaction while they are very wet. Please stay off the fairways with your carts. You may use the 90 degree rule when the fairways are dry, but remember that these fairways are your fairways. This club has invested a lot of money in them: the aeration, sand, seed and chemicals are expensive. They are necessary for green lush fairways. Please help us make the course look and play the best it can

Next week I plan on redoing #1 and #14 green side bunkers. These two bunkers are of great concern to the greens committee. The sand is contaminated with soil and rocks. Both will be enlarged a little and new white sand will be added. While I have the excavator, I will finish cleaning the brush between #10 and #3. This will make the area look much cleaner and will speed up play.
